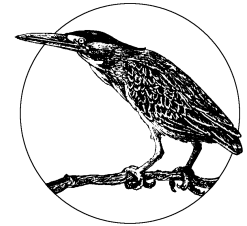

FEBRUARY RECAP

Over 20 people attended the February meeting, including two guests, Mary and Sally. Dana Bollin's presentation on Monarch butterflies was enchanting and enlightening. Monarchs east of the Rockies journey to northern Mexico to go into suspended animation in the high forests (10-12,000 ft above sea level) for the winter; west of the Rockies, they go to the northern Baja peninsula or southern California. Come spring, they work their way north via milkweed, and it can take 2 to 3 generations to make it to Ohio. They then lay one egg on a plant and that caterpillar might eat the entire plant as the caterpillar matures.

TOLEDO MUSEUM OF ART

Before Audubon: Alexander Wilson's
Birds of the United States
April 21-July 15, 2018

In 1808, Scottish-born poet and amateur naturalist Alexander Wilson (1766-1813) began publishing *American Ornithology; or The Natural History of the Birds of the United States*. Wilson's impressive achievement inspired John James Audubon to publish his much better-known *Birds of America* (1827-38). Though Wilson had no background as an artist, he taught himself printmaking and illustrated his nine volumes of careful observations of the birds of the northeastern US with 79 hand-colored engraved and etched plates of 262 species—39 of which he was the first to describe.

Fourth in the Toledo Museum of Art's biennial exhibitions focused on bird-themed art, the exhibition coincides with local birding festival "The Biggest Week in American Birding," which brings tens of thousands of birders to the area to observe the spring migration of songbirds. It will be the first time that the Toledo Museum of Art's first edition of Wilson's pioneering multi-volume publication has been exhibited! Don't miss it!

MARCH MEETING

Speaker: Don Burlett will be our presenter for A Borneo Biding Adventure! Borneo is a mysterious, faraway place with lots of jungles, birds and animals. It's the third-largest island in the world, and the largest in Asia; it's also composed of three countries. We'll visit a variety of habitats to see many exotic birds and animals including orangutan, proboscis monkey and others.

Don was a senior research scientist for Gates Corporation; he worked in the rubber industry for almost 40 years but is now retired. He has been an avid birder since a young boy and has now birded on 6 continents and in 38 countries! Don's world life list has over 5100 species and his ABA life list has over 770 species. Don is president of Oakland Audubon Society (9 years) and was a board member at Seven Ponds Nature Center (8 years).
